Edwin Hsu, Medical Records Clerk: He came from Korn Ferry International as a Data Integrity Analysis for eighteen years!

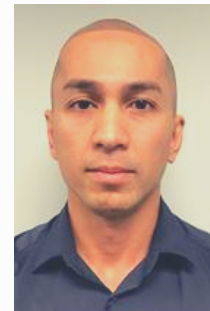

EARTHQUAKE PREPAREDNESS

Were you prepared during our last two major earthquakes in July? Remember, Earthquakes can happen anywhere and happens without warning. Here are some helpful tips to prepare us and our family members to be aware of before the next BIG earthquake strikes again:

- **React Safely:** Learn what to do during an earthquake. Hold periodic family drills to practice what you have learned. Through practice, you can condition yourselves to react spontaneously and safely when the first jolt or shaking is felt.
- **Take Cover:** In each room of your home, identify the safest places to “drop, cover, and hold on” during an earthquake. Practice going to these safe spots during family drills to ensure that everyone learns where they are.
- **Survival Kit:** Assemble and maintain a household emergency supply kit, and be sure that all family members know where it is stored. The kit should consist of first aid, food, and water (e.g., plastic tubs, backpacks, duffel bags) holding the supplies that your family would need to survive without outside assistance for at least 3 days following an earthquake or other disaster.
